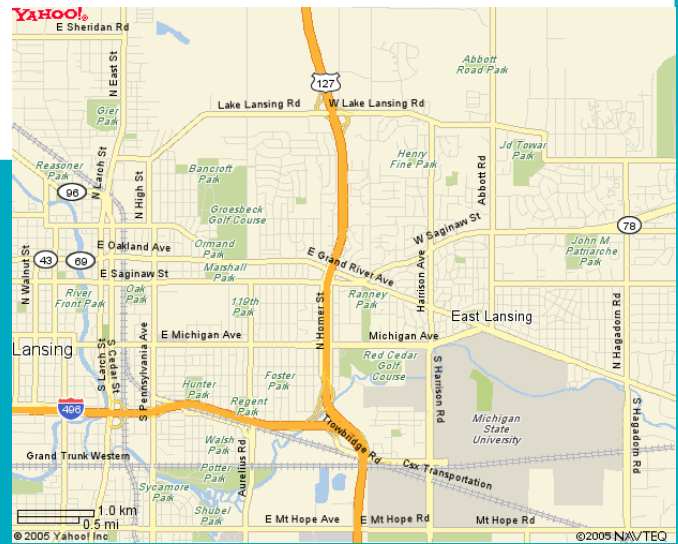

- Amputees discuss their challenges and acceptance of limb loss

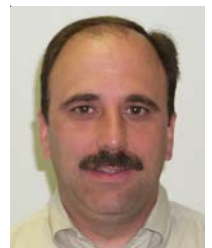
